Even small leaks can lose a lot of water. A dripping faucet can waste as much as 25 gallons of water per day. Take the time to check your home for water leaks. *To test your toilet for leaks, place 3 or 4 drops of food coloring in the toilet tank. Let the toilet set for one to two hours without using or flushing. If the color shows up in the bowl, you have a leak.

**Turn sprinkler system on and walk around to see if sprinklers are working correctly. Make sure you are not watering the sidewalk.
